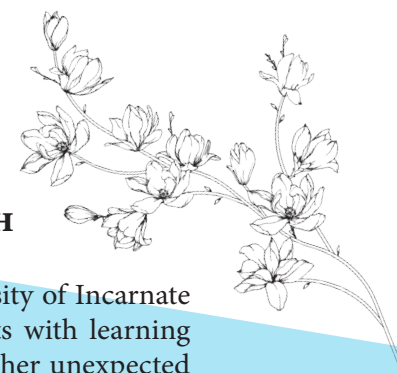

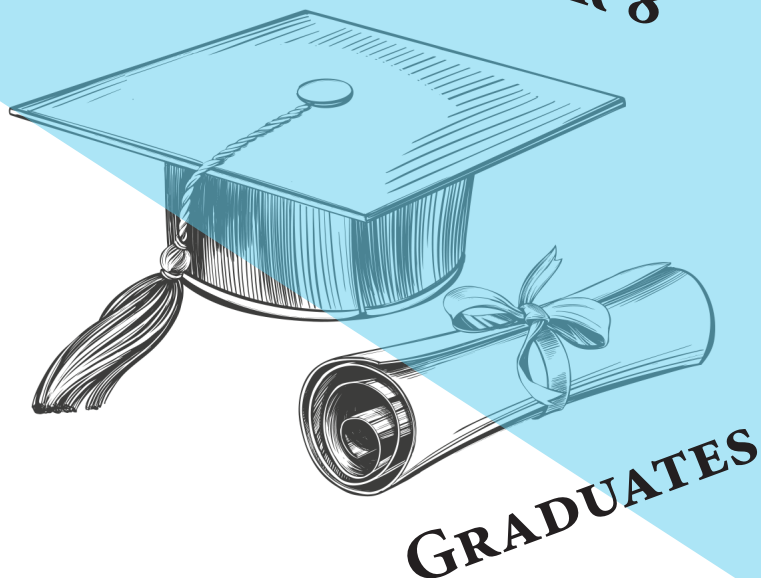

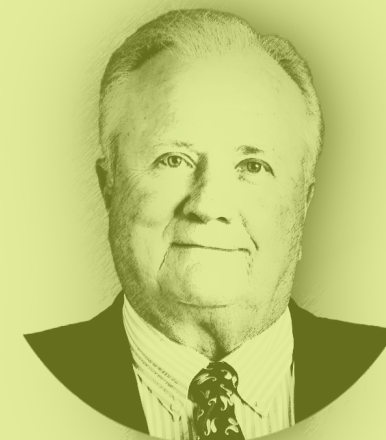

CAPITAL CAMPAIGN

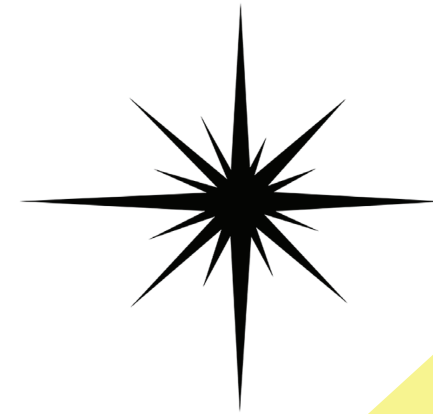


There may be periodic Capital Campaigns that support building and facility needs. Facility enhancements and new construction are carefully considered in the long-term objectives to dramatically improve the school's ability to offer excellence in all of its programs.

Winston's most recent Capital Campaign, the Let's Soar! Campaign for Winston, was successfully completed in 2020 and achieved a goal of \$9.7 million dollars due to the generosity of the Winston community. The Fine Arts Building opened in the Fall of 2020. This addition spans two stories and includes over 23,000 square feet of interior space. In this space you will find the Music Room, Digital Media Room, Art Studio, Ceramic Studio, Black Box Theatre, and Industrial Arts Workshop. This multi-purpose facility also houses a Dining & Assembly Hall, Extended Day Center, Maintenance Bay, conference room and offices.

Overall, Winston supporters were able to raise \$112,000 for tuition assistance and \$15,000 for the Dr. Charles J. Karulak scholarship fund.

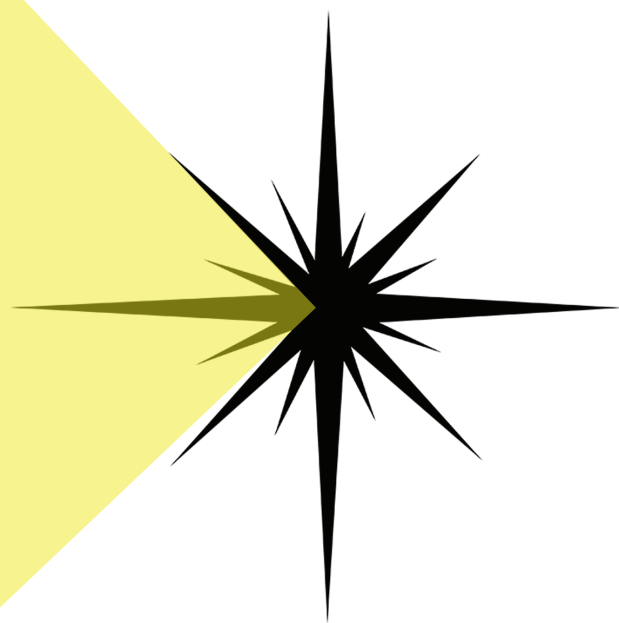
