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SUMMER AT WINSTON

June 2nd – 27th

The Winston School San Antonio (WSSA) Summer Program is designed for students entering grades 1st through 12th grade that struggle and need the benefit of remediation for the upcoming school year. We offer courses in the following three categories:

FUNDAMENTAL	<p>Our fundamental classes work to sustain skills learned throughout the school year and close learning gaps.</p> <p>For high school courses, students have the opportunity to earn 1.0 credit.</p> <p>All courses are taught by highly trained and qualified WSSA teachers to serve students in a multi-sensory learning environment.</p>
ENRICHMENT	<p>Our enrichment classes engage and motivate students to unleash their creative and imaginative minds. Through interactive and collaborative work, these courses provide opportunities for students to learn new skills beyond the academic classroom.</p>
AFTERSCHOOL CARE	<p>If your child has a need for supervision after class from 3:00 to 6:00 pm, we are offering afterschool care for \$175 per week.</p>

Summer at Winston

Our Summer Program features WSSA's unique instructional approach, small class sizes, close monitoring of student progress, and a concentration on the students' strengths. Summer at Winston is open to Winston and non-Winston students with average to above average intelligence who may or may not have a learning difference. A learning difference may include ADHD, Dyslexia, Dysgraphia, and Dyscalculia.

High School Courses for Credit

Credit courses are demanding academically, and the summer schedule is rigorous. Credit will not be awarded to students who miss more than one class. Upon successful completion of a high school summer course, a grade report will be mailed home along with a transcript.

If a student withdraws from a credit course after the start of summer school on Monday, June 3rd, the withdrawal, and withdrawal grade will be noted on the student's permanent record. A withdrawal will require a parent's written authorization.

Afterschool Care

Our Afterschool Care program will be held in the Library from 3:00 to 6:00 pm daily. Students must be picked up on time. Parents arriving after 6:00 pm will be charged \$15 for every 10 minutes that you are late. The fee for Extended Day is \$175 per week. Registration is required.

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LOWER SCHOOL ACADEMICS

Dyslexia Intervention (\$450)	
Grades 3 rd – 4 th	Time: 8:00 to 10:00 am
<p>This intervention class is for students who have a reading disability or are below a grade level or more in reading class during the academic school year. This program is designed to provide strategies to develop and build upon skills in the core areas of phonemic awareness, decoding, and encoding.</p> <p>*Class size is limited to 10 students.</p>	

Reading, Phonics and Spelling (\$450)	
Grades 1 st – 3 rd	Time: 8:00 to 10:00 am
<p>This class is ideal for those who want to give their child an academic boost for the coming school year, or for those who are struggling or experiencing difficulty with reading. Students will engage in varied activities focused on phonics, phonemic awareness, fluency, vocabulary, and comprehension to develop their reading skills.</p>	

Math Intervention (\$450)	
Grades 4 th – 6 th	Time: 8:00 to 10:00 am
<p>The math intervention program uses explicit and targeted instruction and practice of essential concepts. This program is designed for students who are not yet performing at grade level.</p> <p>*Students will be grouped by grade level.*</p>	

Dyslexia Intervention (\$450)	
Grades 5 th & 6 th	Time: 10:00 am to 12:00 pm
<p>This intervention class is for students who have a reading disability or are below a grade level or more in reading class during the academic school year. This program is designed to provide strategies to develop and build upon skills in the core areas of phonemic awareness, decoding, and encoding.</p> <p>*Class size is limited to 10 students.</p>	

Reading Intervention (\$450)	
Grades 3 rd – 6 th	Time: 10:00 am to 12:00 pm
<p>This computer-based Lexia Learning program will provide structure practice focusing on phonemic awareness, phonics, fluency, vocabulary, and comprehension.</p>	

Math Intervention (\$450)	
Grades 4 th – 6 th	Time: 10:00 am to 12:00 pm
<p>The math intervention program uses explicit and targeted instruction and practice of essential concepts. This program is designed for students who are not yet performing at grade level and struggle with mastering basic math facts, place value, computation, fractions, decimals, and measurements.</p>	

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Math Foundations (\$450)	
Grades 1 st – 3 rd	Time: 10:00 am to 12:00 pm
This class refers to the fundamental building blocks of mathematics that young learners acquire during these early years, focusing primarily on concepts like counting, number sense, basic addition and subtraction, simple geometry (shapes), measurement, and understanding place value. All will be taught through hands-on activities and visual representation to build a solid foundation of more complex math later on.	

Afterschool Care (\$175 per week)	
Grades 1 st – 6 th	Time: 3:00 to 6:00 pm
Our Afterschool Care program will be held in the Library from 3:00 to 6:00 pm daily. Students must be picked up on time. Parents arriving after 6:00 pm will be charged \$15 for every 10 minutes that you are late. Registration is required.	

SUMMER ENRICHMENT CLASSES

Content Creation (\$450 for two weeks) June 2 – 13 or June 16 – 27	
Grades 4 th – 6 th	Time: 8:00 to 10:00 am
In Content Creation, students will dive into the basics of graphic design, podcasting, and video editing using Canva, iMovie, and other creative software. Each day, students will take on fun design challenges to build their skills in creating eye-catching graphics, engaging audio clips, and dynamic videos. By the end of the two weeks, students will get to choose whether to put their skills to the test by creating short video or a podcast episode.	

Executive Function (\$650)	
Grades 6 th – 10 th	Time: 10:00 am to 12:00 pm
This course helps students develop a wide range of life skills like organization, time management, goal setting, focus, and self-regulation. Using these tools, students practice and learn to self-advocate and collaborate with teachers, advisors, and other students.	

Algebraic Concepts (\$500) June 2 – 13	
Grades 6 th – 8 th	Time: 1:00 to 3:00 pm
Designed to help students develop their ability to recognize patterns, analyze relationships, and generalize concepts. Essentially laying the foundation for understanding algebra through engaging activities and practice problems. This course is suited for students struggling with algebra during the regular school year, students looking to get ahead, and students needing additional practice and reinforcement in key algebraic thinking skills.	

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Kids Can Cook (\$500)	
Grades 1 st – 5 th	Time: 1:00 to 3:00 pm
Calling all mini chefs and budding superheroes! Join us for a fun-filled cooking class where we will explore the delicious world of food and learn how to fuel and power up our bodies for awesome adventures. Each week will learn a new recipe.	

Little Medical School (\$300) Week 1: June 2 – 6	
Grades 1 st – 5 th	Time: 1:00 to 4:00 pm
Students will become doctors this week and will learn all about the body, its organs and how they function, how to use medical instruments, administer first aid, and discover how to tie knots like a real-life surgeon.	

Little Medical School (\$300) Week 2: June 9 - 13	
Grades 1 st – 5 th	Time: 1:00 to 4:00 pm
Students will become doctors this week and will learn all about the body, its organs and how they function, how to use medical instruments, administer first aid, and discover how to tie knots like a real-life surgeon.	

Little Veterinarian School (\$300) Week 3: June 16 – 20	
Grades 1 st – 5 th	Time: 1:00 to 4:00 pm
Students get hands-on experience taking on the role of a Veterinarian and learning how to perform a nose-to-tail animal exam. Discover the importance of taking care of a pet, proper nutrition, look for ticks, and identify animal body language.	

Little Wilderness School (\$300) Week 4: June 23 – 27	
Grades 1 st – 5 th	Time: 1:00 to 4:00 pm
Students will learn about some of the dangers in the wild such as insect bites, snake bites, poisonous plants. The class will also learn how to splint a broken leg, tie a tourniquet, and how to filter dirty water for drinking.	



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Mad Science - Week 1: Moving with Science

Students will explore crazy chemical reactions, engineering science, simple machines, optics, and the science of birds and beasts.

Cybersecurity (\$1,450)	
Grades 8 th – 12 th	Time: 8:00 am to 12:00 pm
<p>This course is designed for high school and middle school students who are interested in cybersecurity or who have cybersecurity knowledge and want to learn more. No prior cybersecurity knowledge is required for participants.</p> <p><i>*This course is required for Winston students who wish to compete in CyberPatriot competitions in the fall semester.</i></p>	

Conversational Spanish (\$650)	
Grades 7 th – 12 th	Time: 9:00 to 11:00 am
<p>This course is an introduction to the study of the Spanish language with instruction structured to promote the development of speaking and listening skills for direct application within any setting. Students will focus on the development of vocabulary, pronunciations skills, basis sentence patterns, and an overview of the Latin culture.</p>	

SAT/ACT Prep (\$500 f/2 weeks) June 2 nd – 13 th	
Grades 10 th – 12 th	Time: 1:00 to 3:00 pm
<p>This course aims to thoroughly prepare students for the standardized Scholastic Aptitude Test (SAT) and American College Testing (ACT) exams by providing comprehensive review of the test content, format, and question types, alongside teaching effective test-taking strategies to maximize their scores and achieve their desired college admissions goals; this typically includes practice with past test questions, time management techniques, and anxiety reduction strategies across all sections like reading, writing, and math on both exams.</p>	

Athletics – Strength & Conditioning (\$525)	
Grades 7 th – 12 th	Time: 8:00 to 10:00 am
<p>This program is designed to enhance athletic performance and skills while focusing on form, posture, and coordination. Students will also focus on heat acclimation, speed, strength, agility, and conditioning of all sports. This course</p>
